There was a proposal to improve footpaths from Wellington to Macquarie St to link all amenities by adding to pre-existing footpaths. Focus is 3-5 years for access and inclusion. Older residents are getting socially isolated due to unsafe paths as there is only one shop accessible by wheelchair in town</p> <p>ACTION: DCCS to liaise with Community for local inclusion in the DIAP</p>	<p>CCS/ TS</p>	<p>Disability ACTION Plan (DIAP) currently under review.
